Political doctrine of FRAKR

Individualism

Every individual has the right of freedom and expression, the right to choose the way how he/she organizes their life.

The freedom of every individual consist based on the rights where his/her actions do not encroachment the freedom of others.

Liberty and equality

The FRAKR considers the concept of liberty as the state in which people can act and speak freely, and equality is the state of being equal in rights and opportunities. Just because a person is afforded certain liberties does not mean the person is given equality.

Rule of law

The principle that all people and institutions are subject to and accountable to law that is fairly applied and enforced; the principle of government by law where FRAKR can be a promoter of those values.

Dignity of humanity and human rights

All human rights are indivisible, whether they are civil and political rights, such as the right to life, equality before the law and freedom of expression; economic, social and cultural rights, such as the rights to work, social security and education and the rights for development

Protection of environment

Environmental protection is a systematic approach to finding practical ways for saving water, energy, and materials, and reducing negative environmental impacts.

Democratic and tolerant society

The principle of democratic and tolerant society is established on the values of:

freedom of thought, which covers all areas of belief – factual, religious, moral, and so on;

freedom in how we live our lives; and

freedom to unite with others for any purpose to which we agree
