Dear LYMEC family,

I am writing this letter to express my motivation towards running for the position of Internal Auditor of LYMEC and would like to ask for your support in my candidacy.

I have been a longstanding member of the Estonian Reform Party Youth (ERPYP) and have had the honour during this time to both serve as a Board Member and an International Officer. Throughout the time I have been politically active, I have stood strong for classical liberal values to be reflected in our programme, statements, and statutes.

My first time being introduced to the work of LYMEC was in the summer of 2017, when I attended the LYMEC Summer School in Brussels. After this, I have participated in many congresses, where I have also had the opportunity to represent ERPYP for being the cosigner of resolutions that reflect our views as an organisation. Currently, I am in my second year of Law Studies in University of Tartu Tallinn Department of Law. I think that this experience ties well together with the responsibilities of an Internal Auditor, as my previous work has required me to be extremely detailed, thorough and knowledgeable in whatever I do.
